Position Overview

Park Camps (Winter Break Camp) seeks qualified, energetic, and compassionate candidates for Lead Den Instructor for Winter Break Camp 2O25. Under the supervision of the Winter Break Camp Director, this position will serve as the primary adult responsible for the campers in an assigned age group, and will assist Park Camps staff in implementing the program to provide a rich and fun experience for campers. The position requires an aptitude for managing day-to-day interactions with children in Grades Pre-K-5, a strong ability to work collaboratively with the Park Camps team, and flexibility. This is a temporary, hourly position for the following dates: December 22, December 23, December 29, and December 3O, 2O25.

Certifications and Qualifications

- Bachelor's degree or equivalent.
- Experience working with children in a school or daycare environment.
- Ability to plan indoor and outdoor activities for children.
- Must enjoy playing and interacting with children both indoors and outdoors.
- Must take initiative, be self-directed, and capable of independently identifying and solving problems.
- Ability to multitask, prioritize, and manage time efficiently.
- Creative and innovative thinker and planner.
- Ability to serve as a positive role model and mentor.
- Must have good communication skills and work well with both children and adults.

Main Duties and Responsibilities

- Develop and plan engaging and creative activities for the campers.
- Create a schedule of the activities during designated den time.
- Engage and play with campers in a professional manner while creating a fun, inviting, and relaxed environment.
- Supervise campers inside our building as well as outside on our playgrounds to ensure a safe environment as they engage in a variety of activities.
- Communicate group news and plans with parents and other Park Camps staff.
- Represent Park School in a professional, caring, and thoughtful manner at all times.
- Adherence to Park School's philosophy, standards, and goals.

Schedule and Hours

Winter Break Camp runs for four days: December 22, 23, 29, and 30. Hours are 8 a.m. -3:30 p.m. each day. Lead Den Instructors must be available to work all four days of camp. In addition, there will be two hours of paid training that will take place in December before camp begins (time to be determined and coordinated around individual schedules).
